## Whitethorns play area improvements

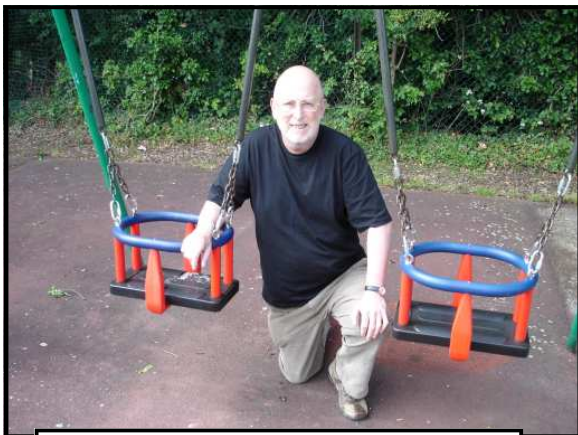
